Galleria Continua is pleased to present as turning death into something beautiful". Distance) by cuban artist Alejandro Campins. The exhibition gathers a group of paintings and drawings that are the result of a journey made by the artist through some regions of **Tibet** in order to document the monasteries destroyed by the Chinese Cultural Revolution.

As in previous series, Campins explores the idea of landscape in its relationship with architecture, seeing the latter as part of the former. He is interested in approaching objects and places that mark the passing of time, and that in turn have the capacity to influence the mindsets and ideologies of an era. That is why space, as a container of information, acquires the condition of a character in his work.

In the series Tibet, the artist starts from a fundamental principle in Tibetan Buddhism: the non-duality of things, a concept through which he tries to see things as they are in order to appreciate their potential and not to classify them as good or bad. This way of perceiving the facts allows him to understand, for example, the effects of the Chinese Cultural Revolution on the spread of Tibetan Buddhism in the West. It is about changing the angle from which you look at things, and seeing the significance of them, their potential and usefulness.

The exhibition and its title refer to another key concept of Tibetan teachings: inner freedom, associated with the search for peace and inner harmony. In this sense, according to Campins, "the vision of an artist is like that of a Buddhist, who transforms into truth and beauty that which we may find negative or horrifying, such

the solo show Distancia interna (Inner Hence, the architectural ruins he presents do not show us a destroyed landscape, but rather speak of the beauty that the passing of time brings with it.
