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GIOVANNI OZZOLA *Atto Unico / Single Act*

Galleria Continua is pleased to present *Atto Unico / Single Act* an exhibition project by Giovanni Ozzola, specifically conceived for the gallery's spaces. Like a theatrical piece, everything occurs and is contained within an all-encompassing image that contemplates a multitude of aspects within itself. The exhibition, designed for the tower's spaces, represents the extremes that are the essence of life: day, night, masculine, feminine, interior, exterior. A *unicum* that includes multiple truths; harmony and contrasts come together in a dense poetry that holds philosophical and universal questions.

The intervention reveals the specificity of Giovanni Ozzola's research that, while embracing different artistic practices - in this case photography, sculpture and installation - is characterized by an investigation that always starts from the observation of the visible world, space and light. Additionally, a dialogue with painting crosses all fields of his practice and is ever-present.

The exhibition itinerary begins with Ta 她 他 (2021), a photographic diptych: on one side, the profuse image of pink light that illuminates an interior, on the other, a blue light that like a blade opens up a passage in the darkness. "Ta in Chinese, indicates both he and her, the pronunciation is the same, only by adding other details can one understand if the Ta is he (他) or she (她), or it / it (它) when it refers to things or inanimate objects. In written language one can clearly see the difference, while in spoken language everything remains suspended, as in a poem. The very concept of Ta harmoniously contemplates and includes contrast. This suspension is conceptually the beginning of the exhibition ", explains the artist.

The entrance serves as a point of union and passage to the two other exhibition areas. In the first room, the artist intervenes with an installation that redefines the space by creating a new horizon. The technique of printing on concrete is the *modus operandi* that has characterized Ozzola's work for many years. "The openings that pierce the walls are urban scars, places with such strong symbolism that

they become archetypal, they offer us an opening to other worlds. They complement each other: to us who look, they give a sense of symmetry, because in those walls we can protect ourselves, in that light we can instead navigate and lose ourselves (...) closed environments that offer a distant perspective allow us to live an exclusive experience, of solitude, which is a word as complex as it is open to the most diverse interpretations. The marks and graffiti are the scars that remind us of our passage. Those structures are our skull and the perspectives are our gaze.", the artist remarks. Giovanni Ozzola places a group of bells recovered from shipwrecked or demolished ships in the second room. "Bells used to signal one's position: an affirmation of the self. I am here, in the night, in the dark, or simply with my eyes closed, I feel, I occupy this place, I am part of what surrounds me but I am a center, a nerve center.", the artist says. *Atto Unico / Single Act* ends with an installation that ideally brings us back to center, to ourselves. To our vocal cords that vibrate, like the cords from which the bells, occupying the heart of the ancient tower, hang.
